Good Shepherd Rules & Expectations



Recognizing the value and worth of each teenager and all those participating in a Good Shepherd Life Teen trip, we have the following expectations to ensure all involved have the best experience.

SHOW LOVE AND RESPECT FOR GOD:

- 1. Pray daily for self and others.
- 2. Be open to receive the Sacraments.
- 3. Participate in the activities.
- 4. Be open, flexible, and have a servant's attitude.
- 5. Represent God in your words and actions.

SHOW LOVE AND RESPECT FOR SELF:

- 1. This is a "no smoking" and "no drugs" trip.
- 2. Responses from both sexes, have requested that the opposite sex dress with modesty. Bare midriffs, spaghetti straps, short-shorts low cut tops, tight pants or guys without shirts are not to be worn at any time during the trip. Remember that you are a temple of the Holy Spirit. Present yourself accordingly.
- 3. Drink plenty of water, obey sleeping times, and make sure you eat all meals. This will allow you to participate and not be tired.
- 4. Any DVDs you bring for the bus or music you share with others should glorify God.
- 5. Come to all scheduled sessions and if you must leave an activity, the Core Team should accompany you since they are responsible for you.

SHOW LOVE AND RESPECT FOR OTHERS:

- 1. Be safe. No horseplay or other potentially harmful actions. Leave all hazardous materials at home.
- 2. All words and actions you use should build up others and not injure. No gossip.
- 3. If a Core Member says something listen.
- 4. The facilities must remain clean and undamaged. Otherwise, you will personally be responsible to pay for the damage.
- 5. Outside visitors to the Life Teen event are not allowed unless you ask permission.
- 6. Make sure that your actions during the activities do not distract others from hearing, seeing, or praying.
- 7. Allow others to sleep. "Lights Out" means that it is time to go to sleep. You should not be in the showers or halls after "Lights Out".

100% cooperation with all Good Shepherd Life Teen rules is expected at all times. If the unfortunate situation arises in which a teen is not following the policies, Good Shepherd may call the parents to have them come and pick up the teen immediately.
